INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This investigation was initiated upon receipt of Memorandum of Transmittal 0079-04-CID789,
from the Prisoner Interview/Interrogation Team (PIT), 75th Military Police Detachment, Baghdad
Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, IZ (AGI), regarding allegations Mr. [REDACTED]
was abused at an unknown location while in the custody of U.S. Coalition Forces. [REDACTED]

Investigation established there was insufficient evidence to prove or disprove the offenses
occurred as alleged by Mr. [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] was captured by 4-5 ADA BN, 1st Cavalry
Division, APO AE 09379, and subsequently interviewed by members of 5th Special Forces
Group (SFG), CJSOTF-AP, where Mr. [REDACTED] alleges he was abused, and then transported to
AGI for internment. Mr. [REDACTED] alleged he was punched and kicked during interrogations,
refused food or water for the first three to four days, and did not receive medical treatment until
the fourth day of detention. Mr. [REDACTED] medical screening indicated he was screened on 11
and 12 Apr 04, with no signs of recent injuries to substantiate abuse. Members of 5th SFG,
CJSOTF-AP, were interviewed and denied abusing or witnessing others abuse Mr. [REDACTED] in
any way and identified him as a cooperative source of information.

DETAILS

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: On 21 Jun 04, the 504th Military Intelligence (MI) Brigade (BDE), Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center (JIDC), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghryeb, Iraq (AGI), reported that Detainee [REDACTED] National Detainee Reporting System (NDRS) # [REDACTED] NFI, alleged he was abused while detained by Coalition Forces (CF) while detained at an unknown location, prior to his arrival at BCCF, AGI.

About 1100, 21 Jun 04, this office received a statement written by SPC [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 [REDACTED] A Co. 202nd MI Battalion (BN), JIDC, BCCF, AGI, detailing [REDACTED] abuse allegations. (See Statement) b7c-4, b6-4

About 1015, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1 reviewed [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 detainee file, and determined he was captured on 11 Apr 04 by "Dakota 4/5th 1st Cav" for participating in an attack against Coalition Forces (CF). Statements and detainee transfer documents indicate that [REDACTED] was transferred from "1st Cav" to "CJSOTF" for interrogation and then back to "1st Cav". Two medical screening records, dated 11 and 12 Apr 04, indicated good health other than minor scratches. No medical record could be located dated 3-4 days after [REDACTED] capture, which contradicts his previous statement of seeing the doctor 3-4 days after his capture. (See Detainee File)

About 1030, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1 with the assistance of Linguist [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 this office, interviewed [REDACTED] regarding his abuse allegation. [REDACTED] stated he was captured on 11 Apr 04 in Rathwania, Baghdad and taken to an unknown location for 7-8 days. He was then taken to a second unknown location for four days before transferring to BCCF. [REDACTED] said that during the first two days at the first location, he was interrogated by 2-3 three English speaking men and one male linguist, while hooded. He said as they asked questions, the men would slap him with an open hand on the back of the head. He said this occurred on the first and second day only. He said on the third or fourth day, a doctor treated him. He said the doctor determined he had irregular breathing and prescribed him medicine. [REDACTED] denied being seen by a doctor on the day of his capture, 11 Apr 04. He was specifically asked if he was kicked during his interrogation and he responded, "No", and that no other physical abuse occurred.

AGENT'S COMMENT: [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 was interviewed about his interrogation, his capture, and his allegation of being forced to sign false confessions for 20 minutes before he mentioned he was hit in any way. A comparison of the [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 previous statement to MI, his detainee file, and this statement reveal the following inconsistencies: Documentation exists indicating he was seen by medical personnel on 11 and 12 Apr 04, not 3-4 days later. In his previous statement he said he was treated for high heart rate, not irregular breathing. During his first statement, he said he was kicked as well as beaten in the head. He now makes no mention of kicking and said he was only slapped in the head.

About 2000, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1 interviewed SPC [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 who stated this was his second interview with [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 and [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 tenth interview since arriving at BCCF. SPC [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 said

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DETAILS

that he reviewed all of ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] interrogation records from BCCE, and found no record of ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] abuse allegations. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] said the records reflect ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] continuing to admit to the attacks during the first two or three interviews. He then said ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] began to waffle when recalling details. He said ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] story would change drastically. About the seventh or eighth interview, ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] began to say he signed the confessions under duress and denied participating in the attack. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] said that at no time prior to this occasion did ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] allege abuse. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] stated that during this particular interview, when talking about the confessions, ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] alleged he was tortured. He stated the allegations ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] told him are recorded in the previous statement. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] specifically remembers ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] saying he was kicked as well as beaten. He recalls one inconsistency when ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] was alleging the abuse. He recalls the issue of ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] being blindfolded, but yet being able to see the confessions were written in English and Arabic. When questioned about this detail, ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] then suddenly related he lifted the blindfold. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] stated that he feels that ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] is lying about the abuse and is just trying to avoid the fact that he signed the confessions.

On 19 Jul 04, this office received a Category I Request for Assistance (RFA) from the 78th Military Police Detachment (CID) (FWD), 3rd Military Police Group, USACIDC, Baghdad, Iraq APO AE 09342. The RFA request this office to locate, fully identify, and interview CW3 [REDACTED] (NFI), SSG [REDACTED] (NFI), and SSG [REDACTED] (NFI), all of 10th SFG, Fort Carson, CO 80913 (FCC), regarding the allegations of detainee/abuse made by Mr. [REDACTED] National Detainee Reporting System Number (NDRS) [REDACTED] while at an unknown location while in the custody of coalition forces. The RFA also requests this office to obtain any documentation pertaining to Mr. [REDACTED] to include prisoner records, interrogation reports, and medical records which may have been maintained from the unit's rotation to Iraq.

About 1430, 19 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] ^{b7c-1,66-1} coordinated with SFC [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} GSC, 10th SFG, FCC, who related CW3 [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} 10th SFG, is on leave until 17 Aug 04, but should still be in the area. SFC [REDACTED] related SSG [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} is assigned to 2nd BN, 5th SFG, Fort Campbell, KY, and there is no record of a SSG [REDACTED] assigned to 10th SFG.

About 1500, 19 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] ^{b7c-1,66-1} coordinated with SFC [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} NCOIC, CI, 10TH SFG, FCC, who related all the records pertaining to the detainees were handed over to the 5th SFG when they took over for 10th SFG at Camp Palaiwada, Iraq. SFC [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} also related he has no information to provide regarding Mr. [REDACTED] and did not work with CW3 [REDACTED] while in Iraq.

About 1115, 20 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] ^{b7c-1,66-1} coordinated with CW3 [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} GSC, 10th SFG, FCC, who related he was on emergency leave in Colorado Springs, CO, until 12 Apr 04, and was in Stuttgart, Germany from 13-14 Apr 04. CW3 [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} related he returned to Iraq on 14 Apr 04, and does not remember Mr. [REDACTED] CW3 [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} also related he did not witness abuse any detainee. CW3 [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} related SSG [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} was assigned to 5th SFG, Fort Campbell, KY, and SSG [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} (NFI) is a reservist. CW3 [REDACTED] ^{b7c-3,66-3} provided a copy of his TDY Settlement for his emergency leave.

DETAILS:

About 1600, 26 Jul 04, this office received a facsimile from 3rd Military Police Group, 78th Military Police Detachment (CID) (FWD), Baghdad, Iraq APO AE 09342, requesting this office fully identify and interview SSG [REDACTED], currently assigned to the Basic Noncommissioned Officers Course (BNCOC), Noncommissioned Officer's Academy (NCOA), Fort Huachuca, AZ 85613 (FHAZ), regarding an allegation that he abused Mr [REDACTED] NDRS# [REDACTED] while in his custody.

About 1745, 26 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] ^{b7c-1, b6-1} advised SSG [REDACTED] ^{b7c-4, b6-4} of his legal rights which he waived and provided a Sworn Statement, wherein he denied he abused any detainees. SSG [REDACTED] stated he was in the presence of the detainees for a total of about three and a half hours on 11 Apr 04, and during that time none of the detainees were mistreated in any way. SSG [REDACTED] further stated he did not see any of the detainees again until about one week later when he was asked to escort one of the detainees from a National Guard Unit, where he signed for the detainee, to the Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force (CJSOFT) Detention Facility. Additionally, SSG [REDACTED] stated the detainee's heads were covered with sand bags during the interview process. (See Rights Waiver Certificate and Sworn Statement)

AGENT'S COMMENT: During the interview, SSG [REDACTED] ^{b7c-4, b6-4} sketched a map of the location of the buildings he was working in. (See Interview Sketch)

STATUS: This action closed in the files of this office. No further investigative activity is anticipated.

WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

On or about the 11th of April of 2004, I was stationed at the Radwania Palace Complex in Baghdad, when I was notified of three detainees captured by a National Guard Unit in the vicinity of Radwania on MSR Tampa exit 12A or 11 (on an overpass). I went to an empty building near gate one. When I arrived I saw the three detainees and I asked that they be separated into three empty rooms in the building. We began to screen the first detainee during his medical screening. I did the screening with an interpreter, a guard and a medic. While I was completing the initial screening information the Doctor went to do the medical screening information from the second detainee. Then I went to do the screening of the second detainee. When I completed that one, I went in to do the screening of the third detainee while the doctor was finishing up the medical screening. That was when the third one admitted he fired the RPG on US forces. I finished getting the information from "three." Then I went to talk to "one," and he admitted he made a mistake when he fired on US forces. When I was done with that, I went outside to eat dinner with the 1SG. While I was outside, I checked the paperwork to ensure they had sworn statements (which I never saw), capture tags, medical evaluations, and the medical screening papers. I told them I would get the personnel screening and the initial screening information. I'm not sure, but I think SGT [REDACTED] 67C-4, 166-4 went inside and spoke to number three. Then we were called back up to the office. That was when I was told they were going to take the detainees to "29 Palms Detention Facility." I informed my chain of command of the information we obtained from the detainees, the current situation of the detainees, where they were going to be moved, who had them, and if they needed to talk to someone that was who had them since we did not have control of them any more. About a week later, I signed one of the detainees out to be talked to by another interrogator. I don't know if the detainee was talked to or not, but I ended up taking him back pretty quickly. It seemed like to me the detainee was in pretty good condition. That was pretty much the condition we left them in when we left them as well. I remember those guys were cooperative. Detainee number three just came out and said he shot at the US forces. He stated he disarmed the RPG and then overshot on purpose. Then I went back and talked to one and that was when he admitted he made a mistake. I am pretty sure that 1SG was not going to allow something like abuse of the detainee was going to happen. I was very impressed at his professionalism.

A: SSG [REDACTED] 67C-4, 166-4

Q: How do you remember this was around the 11th of April, 2004.

A: Because it was close to Easter and we were having a lot of problems around that gate. There were a lot of fire fights those couple of days. Our perimeter was probed around that time. There was lots of information on this area these detainees were captured in.

Q: Do you remember anything more specific about the empty building?

A: It was an old detention facility by the SF battalion there before us. It was in between the Iraqi gate (gate 1) and the second gate. It was near the inspection area.

Q: What was the condition of the detainees when you arrived at the empty building?

A: They seemed to be in pretty good shape. The Doctor did not point out anything adverse about them.

Q: How were they bound?

A: They had plastic cuffs (zip ties) and sand bags over their heads.

Q: Were the sandbags ever removed?

A: Yes, I believe during the medical procedure, but then we put them back on the detainees when the medical screening was finished.

Q: Who put the bags on the detainee's heads?

A: The guards did, and they moved them when we wanted them moved. We did not touch them at all, only the guards did.

Q: Who could see you during the screening process of the detainees?

A: The Doctor, the guard in the room, and the interpreter.

Q: What was each of their names?

A: I don't know. That was the first and only time I met the doctor (she was actually a Medic). I may have met the guards a few more times later, but I don't know who they were. And the interpreter was one of four interpreters we were using. His name may be on the screening report or the TIR, but I don't remember which one it was. It was either [redacted] or the other guy that shot himself in the hand and I can't remember his name, but not [redacted] or [redacted]. I think it was [redacted] b7c-3, b6-3

Q: Was the same guard with you during the interviews of the detainees?

A: There was a different guard with each detainee. The guards stayed in the rooms with the detainees.

Q: How long were you with each of the detainees?

A: Number one was about an hour all together. Number two was about 30 to 40 minutes. And number three was about an hour.

Q: Which one of the three did you sign out about a week later?

A: I believe it was number two. I believe it was the guy that I did not get very much information out of which is what surprised me when I picked him up.

Q: Was there anything else you remember about the detainees?

A: Number one was the biggest guy and there was something about his tan line that led us to believe he was lying. The tans on numbers two and three led us to believe they were telling the truth about their occupations. Two was also kind of stubborn. When the other two caved, that led us to believe that number two was the leader. And I believe number two and number three were brothers or related.

Q: What was the 1SG's name?

A: 1SG [redacted] His AKO account is [redacted]@us.army.mil b7c-3, b6-3

Q: What paperwork was kept on the detainees?

A: We turned over all the paperwork to the National Guard Unit because they were not our detainees and not our responsibility. But when I went to pick up the detainee about a week later, I noticed the paperwork was messed up and I pointed it out to the people I was signing him out from. But I can't remember what was messed up exactly.

Q: What are some of the things you remember the most about your encounter with these detainees?

A: "Three" gave up the information pretty easily. They were the first three we caught in the act with the evidence in their hands. The Guard Unit that captured the detainees 1SG was told not to let that happen again and that his guys should be given the first crack at them. Their S-2 came back asking for an interrogation report on the 2nd detainee. I did not do interrogations, I did screenings and number "two" didn't offer information like the other two, so I did not do a report on him.

Q: What did you mean by you were called back up to the office?

A: Me, the 1SG and the S-2 were talking about what the next step was to do with the detainees. I think we established enough to send them to Abu Ghraib. Then I went up to my office located in the Radmania Palace, since I was not in the National Guard Unit.

Q: Did you ever have any of the detainees sign any statements?

A: I did not personally have any of them sign the paper, but one of the three detainees signed a confession that said, "Yes, I did this." I believe it was in the paperwork of number "two's." That is why I had to escort him back to the "CJSOFT Detention Facility," to get him to sign the paperwork. He was smiling when he went in and he was smiling when he came out.

Q: You said earlier that he was the one that did not give up any information and his paperwork was messed up. Please explain why you would need to take him to get a signature on a confession.

A: Somebody else talked to him after I did. The paperwork, it was either the medical screening paperwork or the capture paperwork that was messed up. I noticed when I was signing him out that either the middle name or the last name did not match the other paperwork.

Q: Who talked to him after you did?

A: It could have been CW3 [redacted] SSG [redacted] CW3 [redacted] or SFC [redacted] or any of the interrogators that worked for the unit that had him. b7c-3, b6-3 b7c-4, b6-4 b7c-4, b6-4

Q: Whom do you think talked to him after you did?

A: I am pretty sure the interrogators for the "29 Palms" talked to him after I did. When I signed him out it was one of the above four named that wanted to talk to him, so it was probably one of them. They were in there a short time, and that guy came out in good shape.

Q: About how long was that detainee in there the second time?

A: Maybe twenty minutes.

Q: How long was the total process of interviewing the detainees from when they entered separate rooms to when they were finished being interviewed?

A: About three to three and a half hours.

Q: What types of procedures did you use to make them uncomfortable or make them talk?

A: With those three we did not have to use one because number three started talking during the screening. There was no reason to put them in any positions. When we talked to number one the second time we just stood him up. And number two is a liar so we did not talk to him after the screening.

Q: If I were there watching the interviews, what would I have seen?

A: You would have seen me talking to a detainee. They were standing the first time until we got to number three who we aloud to sit down but not lay down. Number two kept laying down and we had to have the guard pick him up.

Q: When were the detainees moved out of the empty building?

A: I don't know exactly when they moved them out of the building, but I was told they were going to be moved later that night or earlier the next morning.

Q: Did you kick any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you hit any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you slap any of the detainees in the back of the head or do anything that someone would interpret as you slapping one of them in the back of the head?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you see anyone else hit any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you see anyone kick any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you hear about anyone hitting any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you hear about anyone kicking any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: What types of detainee abuses have you heard about?

A: The Abu Ghraib. I also heard about an Iraqi Air Force General who died in custody of the US from a newspaper. And of course I read about the Afghanistan people that were transported in a container truck and died because of not enough water or holes punched into the truck.

Q: Have you ever witnessed anyone hitting any detainees?

A: Yes, one of our interpreters had an emotional moment and slapped a detainee in the back of the head and I made him stop.

Q: When did this interpreter slap a detainee?

A: When I first got there and we were doing turnovers, in early March of this year. It sounded like the detainee said something to the interpreter.

Q: What was the interpreter's name?

A: I don't know. I got him from the CJSOFT or the old group interpreters. I only used him for that couple of days on those detainees and then he left.

Q: Have you heard about anyone hitting any detainees?

A: Not any names, but you hear that it happens. I never heard that anyone in particular did anything like that.

Q: How were these confessions taken?

A: I don't know because I did not take them?

Q: Did you see any of the confessions written?

A: Yes, I saw them in their packet, but I did not see who took them.

Q: Did the detainees ever complain to you about any abuses?

A: No, they never complained about anything but the temperature and the food.

Q: Were you afforded the opportunity to take breaks?

A: Yes.

Q: Were you offered something to eat and drink?

A: Yes.

Q: How do you feel you were treated here today?

A: I was treated Pretty good.

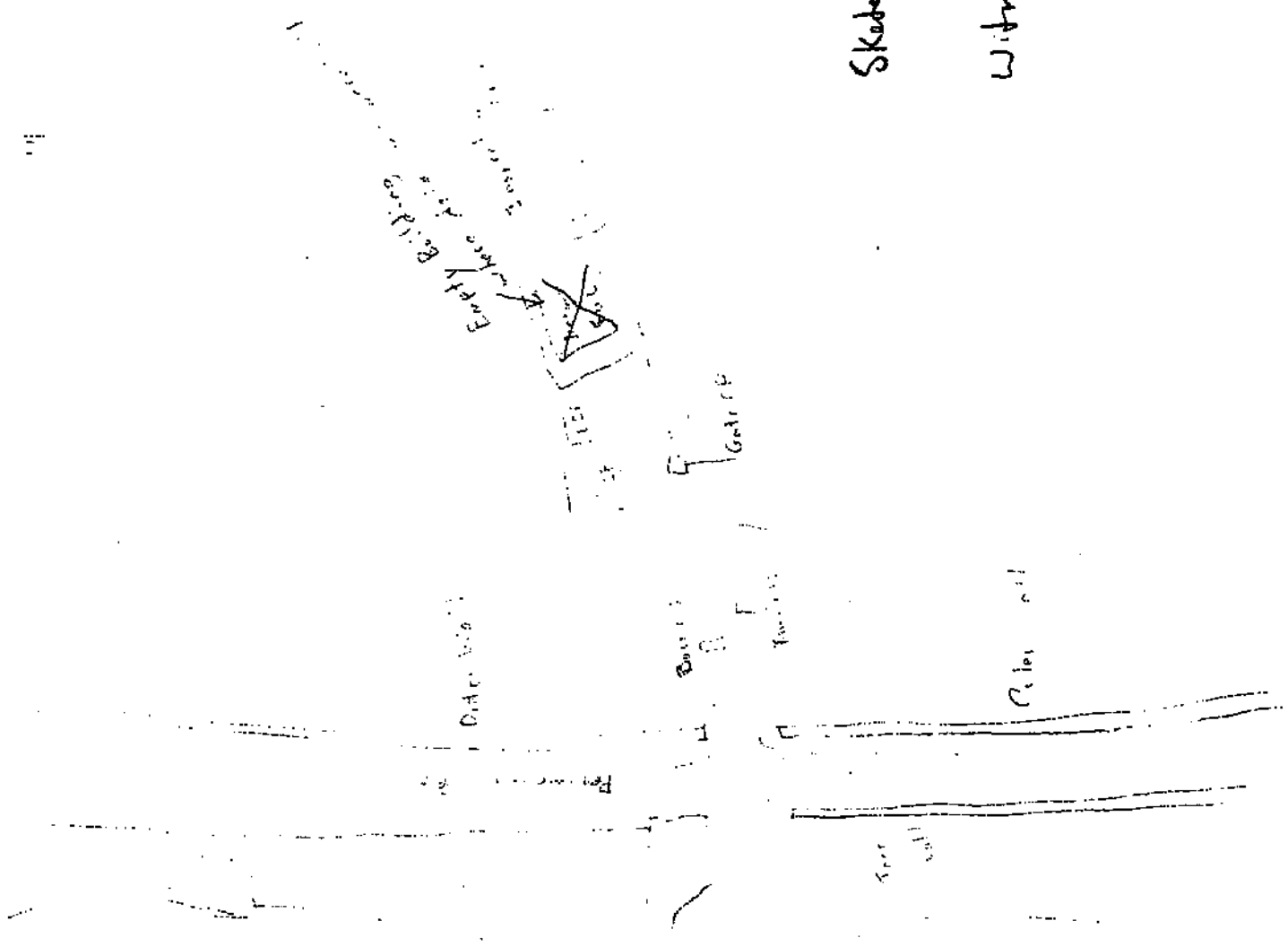
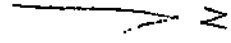

I deployed to Iraq in Feb 04 and returned on 24 July 04. My duty position was as the Battalion's Operations Warrant and Operational Control Element Leader for FOB-Central HUMINT operations. In early April [redacted] was captured by coalition forces responding to an insurgent ambush near the Radwaniyah Palace Complex, BIAP, Iraq. [redacted] was caught with an AK-47 and several magazines, most of which were empty. The Ambush site was near a bridge and under the bridge an RPG was found, as well as, a box containing Improvised Explosive Device items. [redacted] was in-processed into the JSOTF-AP DIF (BIAP) and was medically determined as suited for questioning. [redacted] was first exposed to an explosive residue test, conducted by myself, and tested extremely positive for recent black-powder and explosive residue. This test was immediately placed into an evidence package and documented. Enough evidence for further processing was gained at the capture site, coupled with the explosive residue positive testing. After confirming biographical information, [redacted] was informed of the circumstances of his detention and potential pending charges. From this point on [redacted] began to inform myself, and SFC [redacted] -my assistant, as to people who had convinced him to join the ambush party. [redacted] was considered at this time a cooperative source of information. His tribal Sheik, [redacted] was the primary influencer or exploiter of people like [redacted] who joined the insurgents' ambush to gain 'wasta' with his sheik. [redacted] asked if he provided other names could he be released or reduce the amount of time spent in jail. I told him that this was a matter that military courts would decide, but his information might mitigate the length of his sentencing. [redacted] then told me of the Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures used by the insurgents to set-up the ambush sites, and their early warning system - this information confirmed other reporting but appeared that [redacted] was intentionally diverting the conversation from his tribal sheik's current location. When I asked [redacted] to go with us and point out the sheik's residence and others who were involved in the ambush, he broke down crying stating that his family would be killed. At this point the questioning ceased for the day. The second day I questioned [redacted] in the morning and the evening trying to pinpoint locations of other insurgents and tribal leadership. [redacted] stuck to his previous days statements, but would not provide locations and assured me he would never be present in front of [redacted] if his tribal sheik were captured, and he would not testify against him. Again stating his wife and children would be killed. I suspected that this would not change, and ordered his further detainee processing into the Abu Ghurayb pipeline. He was never questioned by any other JSOTF-AP soldiers. [redacted] was never struck, kicked, slapped, denied basic medical services, food or water, or religious practices during his time at JSOTF-AP Detainee Interrogation Facility (DIF). [redacted]

I was deployed to Iraq on 18 February 2004 and remained TDY until 20 July 2004. While in Iraq I resided at the Radwanayah Palace Complex (RPC) under CJSOTF-AP control. My principal duties during the deployment was the assistant to CW3 [redacted] (OCE supervisor) involving HUMINT activities. In early to mid April, 2004, (around Easter Sunday) there were numerous ambushes that occurred in the Radwanayah area. During one of these ambushes the CJSOTF-AP Quick Reaction Force (QRF) was dispatched to assist other elements under attack. While enroute the QRF was itself ambushed, reportedly by mortars, machine guns, small arms, and Rocket Propelled Grenades (RPG's). After gaining control of the situation the QRF detained a man named [redacted] from [redacted] underneath a bridge, he was obviously involved in the ambush and armed with an AK-47. [redacted] was captured with an RPG, explosive materials, his AK-47 (one and a half magazines expended and one full magazine) and other personnel. [redacted] was processed into the Detention Isolation Facility (DIF) and medically screened. CW3 [redacted] read the medical screening report prior to his interview process. During [redacted] stay at the DIF he was encouraged to eat and drink and did. He was also encouraged to practice any religious ritual (such as praying) within reason that was feasible and did. [redacted] was told at the beginning of the interview process the circumstances of his capture and the obvious evidence against him. Faced with this glaring unshakeable evidence [redacted] was a cooperative detainee and provided information concerning insurgent cell leadership, particularly [redacted]. [redacted] was asked to personally identify (PID) [redacted] residence but didn't want to because he was afraid that his family would be killed if he did this. When interviewed further about [redacted] he would go back to his story about the ambush and delay the interview. [redacted] was then asked to sign sworn confessions concerning his obvious involvement in an ambush against American Forces and Insurgent cell leadership information he had provided during his initial interview. [redacted] signed these statements of his own accord, willingly, without any coercion, promises, or threats. I believe that [redacted] was looking for any way to mitigate his obviously bad situation. [redacted] refused to PID [redacted] and it was decided that he be sent to Abu Ghayib (AG) Prison due to the evidence against him and his unwillingness to cooperate any further. [redacted] was medically screened at least once a day and finally upon his transfer to AG. [redacted] was interviewed by CW3 [redacted] and I acted as his assistant in all matters. [redacted] was not interviewed by any other person besides CW3 [redacted] CW3 [redacted] and myself were together throughout the duration of each interview. At no time was [redacted] ever hit or kicked in any fashion whatsoever. [redacted] had but a few scratches on him at the time of capture and was released from the DIF without any injuries. I believe that [redacted] got to AG during the time of the incidents publicized and during his stay fabricated allegations in hopes of mitigating or completely absolving

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: On 21 Jun 04, the 504th Military Intelligence (MI) Brigade (BDE), Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center (JIDC), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghuryeb, Iraq (AGI), reported that Detainee [REDACTED] National Detainee Reporting System (NDRS) # [REDACTED] NFI, alleged he was abused while detained by Coalition Forces (CF) while detained at an unknown location, prior to his arrival at BCCF, AGI.

About 1100, 21 Jun 04, this office received a statement written by SPC [REDACTED] A Co. 202nd MI Battalion (BN), JIDC, BCCF, AGI, detailing [REDACTED] abuse allegations. (See Statement)

About 1015, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] reviewed [REDACTED] detainee file, and determined he was captured on 11 Apr 04 by "Dakota 4/5th 1st Cav" for participating in an attack against Coalition Forces (CF). Statements and detainee transfer documents indicate that [REDACTED] was transferred from "1st Cav" to "CJSOTF" for interrogation and then back to "1st Cav". Two medical screening records, dated 11 and 12 Apr 04, indicated good health other than minor scratches. No medical record could be located dated 3-4 days after [REDACTED] capture, which contradicts his previous statement of seeing the doctor 3-4 days after his capture. (See Detainee File)

About 1030, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] with the assistance of Linguist [REDACTED] this office, interviewed [REDACTED] regarding his abuse allegation. [REDACTED] stated he was captured on 11 Apr 04 in Rathwania, Baghdad and taken to an unknown location for 7-8 days. He was then taken to a second unknown location for four days before transferring to BCCF. [REDACTED] said that during the first two days at the first location, he was interrogated by 2-3 three English speaking men and one male linguist, while hooded. He said as they asked questions, the men would slap him with an open hand on the back of the head. He said this occurred on the first and second day only. He said on the third or fourth day, a doctor treated him. He said the doctor determined he had irregular breathing and prescribed him medicine. [REDACTED] denied being seen by a doctor on the day of his capture, 11 Apr 04. He was specifically asked if he was kicked during his interrogation and he responded, "No", and that no other physical abuse occurred.

AGENT'S COMMENT: [REDACTED] was interviewed about his interrogation, his capture, and his allegation of being forced to sign false confessions for 20 minutes before he mentioned he was hit in any way. A comparison of the [REDACTED] previous statement to MI, his detainee file, and this statement reveal the following inconsistencies: Documentation exists indicating he was seen by medical personnel on 11 and 12 Apr 04, not 3-4 days later. In his previous statement he said he was treated for high heart rate, not irregular breathing. During his first statement, he said he was kicked as well as beaten in the head. He now makes no mention of kicking and said he was only slapped in the head.

that he reviewed all of [redacted] interrogation records from BCGF, and found no record of [redacted] abuse allegations. SPC [redacted] said the records reflect [redacted] continuing to admit to the attacks during the first two or three interviews. He then said [redacted] began to waffle when recalling details. Additionally, SSG [REDACTED] stated the detainee's heads were covered with sand bags during the interview process. (See Rights Waiver Certificate and Sworn Statement)

I WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH: On or about the 11th of April of 2004, I was stationed at the Radwanla Palace Complex in Baghdad, when I was notified of three detainees captured by a National Guard Unit in the vicinity of Radwanla on MSR Tampa exit 12A or 11 (on an overpass). I went to an empty building near gate one. When I arrived I saw the three detainees and I asked that they be separated into three empty rooms in the building. We began to screen the first detainee during his medical screening. I did the screening with an interpreter, a guard and a medic. While I was completing the initial screening information the Doctor went to do the medical screening information from the second detainee. Then I went to do the screening of the second detainee. When I completed that one, I went in to do the screening of the third detainee while the doctor was finishing up the medical screening. That was when the third one admitted he fired the RPG on US forces. I finished getting the information from "three." Then I went to talk to "one," and he admitted he made a mistake when he fired on US forces. When I was done with that, I went outside to eat dinner with the 1SG. While I was outside, I checked the paperwork to ensure they had sworn statements (which I never saw), capture tags, medical evaluations, and the medical screening papers. I told them I could get the personnel screening and the initial screening information. I'm not sure, but I think SGT [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 was inside and spoke to number three. Then we were called back up to the office. That was when I was told they were going to take the detainees to "29 Palms Detention Facility." I informed my chain of command of the information we obtained from the detainees, the current situation of the detainees, where they were going to be moved, who had them, and if they needed to talk to someone that was who had them since we did not have control of them any more. About a week later, I signed one of the detainees out to be talked to by another interrogator. I don't know if the detainee was talked to or not, but I ended up taking him back pretty quickly. It seemed like to me the detainee was in pretty good condition. That was pretty much the condition we left them in when we left them as well. I remember those guys were cooperative. Detainee number three just came out and said he shot at the US forces. He stated he disarmed the RPG and then overshoot on purpose. Then I went back and talked to one and that was when he admitted he made a mistake. I am pretty sure that 1SG was not going to allow something like abuse of the detainee was going to happen. I was very impressed at his professionalism.

A: SSG [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4
Q: How do you remember this was around the 11th of April, 2004.
A: Because it was close to Easter and we were having a lot of problems around that gate. There were a lot of fire fights those couple of days. Our perimeter was probed around that time. There was lots of information on this area these detainees were captured in.
Q: Do you remember anything more specific about the empty building?
A: It was an old detention facility by the SF battalion there before us. It was in between the Iraqi gate (gate 1) and the second gate. It was near the inspection area.
Q: What was the condition of the detainees when you arrived at the empty building?
A: They seemed to be in pretty good shape. The Doctor did not point out anything adverse about them.
Q: How were they bound?
A: They had plastic cuffs (zip ties) and sand bags over their heads.
Q: Were the sandbags ever removed?
A: Yes, I believe during the medical procedure, but then we put them back on the detainees when the medical screening was finished.
Q: Who put the bags on the detainee's heads?
A: The guards did, and they moved them when we wanted them moved. We did not touch them at all, only the guards did.

Q: Who could see you during the screening process of the detainees?

A: The Doctor, the guard in the room, and the interpreter.

Q: What was each of their names?

A: I don't know. That was the first and only time I met the doctor (she was actually a Medic). I may have met the guards a few more times later, but I don't know who they were. And the interpreter was one of four interpreters we were using. His name may be on the screening report or the TIR, but I don't remember which one it was. It was either [REDACTED] or the other guy that shot himself in the hand and I can't remember his name, but not [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]. I think it was [REDACTED] b7C-3, b6-3.

Q: Was the same guard with you during the interviews of the detainees?

A: There was a different guard with each detainee. The guards stayed in the rooms with the detainees.

Q: How long were you with each of the detainees?

A: Number one was about an hour all together. Number two was about 30 to 40 minutes. And number three was about an hour.

Q: Which one of the three did you sign out about a week later?

A: I believe it was number two. I believe it was the guy that I did not get very much information out of which is what surprised me when I picked him up.

Q: Was there anything else you remember about the detainees?

A: Number one was the biggest guy and there was something about his tan line that led us to believe he was lying. The tans on numbers two and three led us to believe they were telling the truth about their occupations. Two was also kind of stubborn. When the other two caved, that led us to believe that number two was the leader. And I believe number two and number three were brothers or related.

Q: What was the ISG's name?

A: ISG [REDACTED] His AKO account is [REDACTED]@us.army.mil

Q: What paperwork was kept on the detainees?

A: We turned over all the paperwork to the National Guard Unit because they were not our detainees and not our responsibility. But when I went to pick up the detainee about a week later, I noticed the paperwork was messed up and I pointed it out to the people I was signing him out from. But I can't remember what was messed up exactly.

Q: What are some of the things you remember the most about your encounter with these detainees?

A: "Three" gave up the information pretty easily. They were the first three we caught in the act with the evidence in their hands. The Guard Unit that captured the detainees ISG was told not to let that happen again and that his guys should be given the first crack at them. Their S-2 came back asking for an interrogation report on the 2nd detainee. I did not do interrogations, I did screenings and number "two" didn't offer information like the other two, so I did not do a report on him.

Q: What did you mean by you were called back up to the office?

A: Me, the ISG and the S-2 were talking about what the next step was to do with the detainees. I think we established enough to send them to Abu Ghraib. Then I went up to my office located in the Radmania Palace, since I was not in the National Guard Unit.

Q: Did you ever have any of the detainees sign any statements?

A: I did not personally have any of them sign the paper, but one of the three detainees signed a confession that said, "Yes, I did this." I believe it was in the paperwork of number "two's." That is why I had to escort him back to the "CJSOFT Detention Facility," to get him to sign the paperwork. He was smiling when he went in and he was smiling when he came out.

Q: You said earlier that he was the one that did not give up any information and his paperwork was messed up. Please explain why you would need to take him to get a signature on a confession.

A: Somebody else talked to him after I did. The paperwork, it was either the medical screening paperwork or the capture paperwork that was messed up. I noticed when I was signing him out that either the middle name or the last name did not match the other paperwork.

Q: Who talked to him after you did? b7C-3, b6-3

A: It could have been CW3 [REDACTED] SSG [REDACTED] CW3 [REDACTED] or SFC [REDACTED] or any of the interrogators that worked for the unit that had him. b7C-4, b6-4

Q: Whom do you think talked to him after you did?

A: I am pretty sure the interrogators for the "29 Palms" talked to him after I did. When I signed him, out it was one of the above four named that wanted to talk to him, so it was probably one of them. They were in there a short time, and that guy came out in good shape.

A: Maybe twenty minutes.

Q: How long was the total process of interviewing the detainees from when they entered separate rooms to when they were finished being interviewed?

A: About three to three and a half hours.

Q: What types of procedures did you use to make them uncomfortable or make them talk?

A: With those three we did not have to use one because number three started talking during the screening. There was no reason to put them in any positions. When we talked to number one the second time we just stood him up. And number two is a liar so we did not talk to him after the screening.

Q: If I were there watching the interviews, what would I have seen?

A: You would have seen me talking to a detainee. They were standing the first time until we got to number three who we aloud to sit down but not lay down. Number two kept laying down and we had to have the guard pick him up.

Q: When were the detainees moved out of the empty building?

A: I don't know exactly when they moved them out of the building, but I was told they were going to be moved later that night or earlier the next morning.

Q: Did you kick any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you hit any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you slap any of the detainees in the back of the head or do anything that someone would interpret as you slapping one of them in the back of the head?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you see anyone else hit any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you see anyone kick any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you hear about anyone hitting any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: Did you hear about anyone kicking any of the detainees?

A: No I did not.

Q: What types of detainee abuses have you heard about?

A: The Abu Ghraib. I also heard about an Iraqi Air Force General who died in custody of the US from a newspaper. And of course I read about the Afghanistan people that were transported in a container truck and died because of not enough water or holes punched into the truck.

Q: Have you ever witnessed anyone hitting any detainees?

A: Yes, one of our interpreters had an emotional moment and slapped a detainee in the back of the head and I made him stop.

Q: When did this interpreter slap a detainee?

A: When I first got there and we were doing turnovers, in early March of this year. It sounded like the detainee said something to the interpreter.

Q: What was the interpreter's name?

A: I don't know. I got him from the CJSOFT or the old group interpreters. I only used him for that couple of days on those detainees and then he left.

Q: Have you heard about anyone hitting any detainees?

A: Not any names, but you hear that it happens. I never heard that anyone in particular did anything like that.

Q: How were these confessions taken?

A: I don't know because I did not take them?

Q: Did you see any of the confessions written?

A: Yes, I saw them in their packet, but I did not see who took them.

Q: Did the detainees ever complain to you about any abuses?

A: No, they never complained about anything but the temperature and the food.

[REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 want to make the following statement under oath:
I deployed to Iraq in Feb 04 and returned on 24 July 04. My duty position was as the Battalion's Operations Warrant and Operational Control Element Leader for FOB-Central HUMINT operations. In early April [REDACTED] was captured by coalition forces responding to an insurgent ambush near the Radwaniyah Palace Complex, BIAP, Iraq. [REDACTED] was caught with an AK-47 and several magazines, most of which were empty. The Ambush site was near a bridge and under the bridge an RPG was found, as well as, a box containing Improvised Explosive Device items. [REDACTED] was in-processed into the JSOTF-AP DIF (BIAP) and was medically determined as suited for questioning. [REDACTED] was first exposed to an explosive residue test, conducted by myself, and tested extremely positive for recent black-powder and explosive residue. This test was immediately placed into an evidence package and documented. Enough evidence for further processing was gained at the capture site, coupled with the explosive residue positive testing. After confirming biographical information, [REDACTED] was informed of the circumstances of his detention and potential pending charges. From this point on [REDACTED] began to inform myself, and SFC [REDACTED] -my assistant, as to people who had convinced him to join the ambush party. [REDACTED] was considered at this time a cooperative [REDACTED]. His tribal Sheik, [REDACTED] was the primary influencer or exploiter of people like [REDACTED] who joined the insurgents' ambush to gain 'wasta' with his sheik. [REDACTED] asked if he provided other names could he be released or reduce the amount of time spent in jail. I told him that this was a matter that military courts would decide, but his information might mitigate the length of his sentencing. [REDACTED] then told me of the Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures used by the insurgents to set-up the ambush sites, and their early warning system - this information confirmed other reporting but appeared that [REDACTED] was intentionally diverting the conversation from his tribal sheik's current location. When I asked [REDACTED] to go with us and point out the sheik's residence and others who were involved in the ambush, he broke down crying stating that his family would be killed. At this point the questioning ceased for the day. The second day I questioned [REDACTED] in the morning and the evening trying to pinpoint locations of other insurgents and tribal leadership. [REDACTED] stuck to his previous days statements, but would not provide locations and assured me he would never be present in front of [REDACTED] if his tribal sheik were captured, and he would not testify against him. Again stating his wife and children would be killed. I suspected that this would not change, and ordered his further detainee processing into the Abu Ghurayb pipeline. He was never questioned by any other JSOTF-AP soldiers. [REDACTED] was never struck, kicked, slapped, denied basic medical services, food or water, or religious practices during his time at JSOTF-AP Detainee Interrogation Facility (DIF).

I was deployed to Iraq on 18 February 2004 and remained TDY until 20 July 2004. While in Iraq I resided at the Radwaniyah Palace Complex (RPC) under CJSOTF-AP control. My principal duties during the deployment was the assistant to CW3 [REDACTED] (OCB supervisor) involving HUMINT activities. In early to mid April, 2004, (around Easter Sunday) there were numerous ambushes that occurred in the Radwaniyah area. During one of these ambushes the CJSOTF-AP Quick Reaction Force (QRF) was dispatched to assist other elements under attack. While enroute the QRF was itself ambushed, reportedly by mortars, machine guns, small arms, and Rocket Propelled Grenades (RPG's). After gaining control of the situation the QRF detained a man named [REDACTED] from underneath a bridge, he was obviously involved in the ambush and armed with an AK-47. [REDACTED] was captured with an RPG, explosive materials, his AK-47 (one and a half magazines expended and one full magazine) and other personnel. [REDACTED] was processed into the Detention Isolation Facility (DIF) and medically screened. CW3 [REDACTED] read the medical screening report prior to his interview process. During [REDACTED] stay at the DIF he was encouraged to eat and drink and did. He was also encouraged to practice any religious ritual (such as praying) within reason that was feasible and did. [REDACTED] was told at the beginning of the interview process the circumstances of his capture and the obvious evidence against him. Faced with this glaring unshakeable evidence [REDACTED] was a cooperative detainee and provided information concerning insurgent cell leadership, particularly [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was asked to personally identify (PID) [REDACTED] residence but didn't want to because he was afraid that his family would be killed if he did this. When interviewed further about [REDACTED] he would go back to his story about the ambush and delay the interview. [REDACTED] was then asked to sign sworn confessions concerning his obvious involvement in an ambush against American Forces and insurgent cell leadership information he had provided during his initial interview. [REDACTED] signed these statements of his own accord, willingly, without any coercion, promises, or threats. I believe that [REDACTED] was looking for any way to mitigate his obviously bad situation. [REDACTED] refused to PID [REDACTED] and it was decided that he be sent to Abu Ghayib (AG) Prison due to the evidence against him and his unwillingness to cooperate any further. [REDACTED] was medically screened at least once a day and finally upon his transfer to AG. [REDACTED] was interviewed by CW3 [REDACTED] and I acted as his assistant in all matters, [REDACTED] was not interviewed by any other person besides CW3 [REDACTED]. CW3 [REDACTED] and myself were together throughout the duration of each interview. At no time was [REDACTED] ever hit or kicked in any fashion whatsoever. [REDACTED] had but a few scratches on him at the time of capture and was released from the DIF without any injuries. I believe that [REDACTED] got to AG during the time of the incidents publicized and during his stay fabricated allegations in hopes of mitigating or completely absolving
